One Square Meter Berber matched four different cooperatives in rural Morocco with accomplished international artists from the Netherlands, to share techniques, knowledge, and experiences.

The first result of this collaboration are four self-portraits in the form of a "one square meter Berber" produced during a trip to Morocco as a dialogue between the weavers and designers. The crafts women shared their knowledge and technique, while the designers pushed the conceptual boundaries of the production method; distilling modern narratives and bringing the craft to the 21st century.


