Value Additions	Description	Usage	Dependency
Tracing Design	Transfer the design onto the fabric using a stencil or chalk.	Custom	Artisans & Craftsmen
Frame Setup	Stretch the fabric on a wooden frame to keep it taut.	Custom	Artisans & Craftsmen
Thread Selection	Select the desired thread colors and types (usually metallic threads).	Custom	Raw Materials
Needle Threading	Thread a fine needle with the chosen thread.	Custom	Artisans & Craftsmen
Outlining	Begin with outlining the design using a backstitch or chain stitch.	Custom	Artisans & Craftsmen
